What does the word apprehensive mean? Have you ever been in a situation where you have felt apprehensive? Write a short passage to describe the situation you were in to feel this way.</p> <p>Look up the word succumbed in a dictionary. What does it mean? Can you use it in a sentence of your own.</p>
